DICT's Free Wi-Fi for All a big 'push' for Cavite schools



CARMONA CITY, Cavite — The Free Wi-Fi for All program is set to boost the connectivity of public schools and State Universities and Colleges (SUC) in Cavite Province, driving further success to instruction and community-centered research programs.

Following the Free Public Internet Access Program launch of the

Department of Information and Communications Technology (DICT) on May 21, the Cavite State University (CvSU) highlighted the critical role of unlimited internet access for academic institutions.

Dr. Jonathan Digma, Campus Administrator for CvSU Silang campus, underscored that the Free Wi-Fi for All program is crucial in driving their community extension programs.

In line with the theme: "Bringing Public Services Faster and Closer to the People," the SSS eWheels Palengke Caravan was successfully launched in Quezon City on 25 May 2026, marking the start of its nationwide rollout aimed at making social security services more accessible, especially for workers, pensioners, and members in underserved areas.

From 25 to 28 May 2026, the caravan reached key locations

nationwide, including Metro Manila, Calapan (Oriental Mindoro), Legazpi (Albay), Silay City (Negros Occidental), Siargao Island (Surigao del Norte), and Virac (Catanduanes), before concluding the series of activities.

Sa bawat huli, may bagong simula

Sa tinaguriang seafood capital ng Pilipinas, isang simpleng babae ang patuloy na lumalaban sa araw-araw na hanapbuhay ng pagbebenta ng lamang-dagat. Siya si Regina Alisas mula sa Barangay Libas, Roxas City, Capiz. Sa kanilang bahay, dama ang simoy ng dagat dahil sa sariwang isda na kanilang inihahanda at iniimbak para ibenta. Bago pa man sumikat ang araw, dumarating ang mga kahon ng bagong huli na kanilang ipinadadala sa mga restaurant at tindahan sa iba't ibang karatig-lalawigan.

Mahabang taon ng pagsubok at pagpupunyagi

Hindi na bago kay Regina ang ganitong hanapbuhay. Halos 38 taon na siyang nasa seafood trading. Bago pa man siya nagkaroon ng kasalukuyang negosyo sa Capiz, sinubukan na rin niya ang pagbebenta ng buhay na sugpo at hipon sa Maynila. Mabigat ang trabaho ngunit naging tulay ito upang makapagsimula siya ng kabuhatan para sa kanilang pamilya.

Sa likod ng tagumpay ay marami siyang kinaharap na pagsubok. Noong 2014, nagkasakit ang kanyang asawa ng chronic kidney disease, kaya kinailangan nilang ibenta ang kanilang mga bangkang pangisda na naging malaking tulong sa negosyo. Hindi nagtagal ay pumanaw rin ang kanyang asawa, na nag-iwan ng matinding lungkot at hamon sa pamilya.

Sa kabila nito, ipinagpatuloy ni Regina ang buhay. Ngunit muling dumating ang pagsubok nang tumama ang COVID-19 pandemic. Halos huminto ang kanilang negosyo dahil sa mga limitasyon at kaunting mamimili. Ang mga pinaghirapan niya sa loob ng maraming taon ay tila biglang nawala.

Bagong simula at muling pagbangon

Noong 2021, nagpasya si Regina na muling magsimula. Sa tulong ng kaniyang anak na nagbigay ng panimulang kapital, muli nilang binuhay ang seafood trading business. Kasabay nito, naging kliyente rin siya ng CARD, Inc. (A Microfinance NGO) at nakakuha ng unang loan na PHP 3,000 na ginamit nilang pandagdag puhunan.

Mula rito, unti-unti nilang pinalawak ang negosyo. Bukod sa hipon at sugpo, nagdagdag sila ng iba't ibang seafood tulad ng pusit, alimango, lobster, shellfish, scallops, boneless bangus, at lapu-lapu. May frozen at buhay na produkto rin sila, kung saan ang frozen ay galing Masbate at ang live seafood ay binibili sa Capiz.

Mula sa kanilang bahay, nagsusuplay na si Regina sa mga restawran at stall owners sa Iloilo at Boracay. Sa kasalukuyan, umaabot na sa walong malalaking freezer ang ginagamit nila bilang imbakan, kasama ang holding tanks para sa live seafood. Mula sa maliit na pagsisimula, naging maayos at tuloy-tuloy ang kanilang negosyo.

Hindi man nawawala ang hamon, tulad ng pagkaantala sa pagbabayad ng ilang customers, nananatiling matatag si Regina. Para sa kaniya, mas madali na ito kumpara sa panahong halos wala silang benta noong pandemya. Kaya ang paghinhintay at pakikipag-ugnayan sa customers ay bahagi na lamang ng kanilang negosyo.

Dahil sa kanilang pagiging matatag at maasahan, nakuha rin nila ang tiwala ng kanilang mga suplayer na patuloy na sumusuporta sa kanilang negosyo.

Pamilya, negosyo, at panibagong kinabukasan

Sa pag-unlad ng negosyo, nakapag-invest na rin sila sa sariling sasakyan tulad ng utility vehicle at pickup na ginagamit sa pagdadala ng seafood products. Ang negosyo nilang ito ay naging isang family enterprise na pinatatakbo ni Regina kasama ang kaniyang anak at manugang.

Para kay Regina, ang tagumpay ay hindi nakukuha sa madaliang paraan kundi sa tiyaga. "Sipag lang," ang payak niyang payo sa mga gustong magsimula pa lamang.

Sa kabila ng mahigit tatlong dekada sa seafood trading, nananatiling kliyente ng CARD, Inc. si Regina na patuloy na sumusuporta sa paglago ng kanilang negosyo.

Ang kaniyang kuwento ay patunay na sa kabila ng matitinding pagsubok, laging may pagkakataon na muling magsimula at bumangon sa buhay.

PhilHealth, Pinalalawig ang YAKAP at GAMOT Program

Mas pinalakas pa ng PhilHealth Regional Office IV-A ang kampanya nito para sa malawakan at abot-kayang kalusugan sa pamamagitan ng puspusang pagpapatupad ng dalawang pangunahing programa: ang Yaman ng Kalusugan Program (YAKAP) at ang Guaranteed and Accessible Medications for Outpatient Treatment (GAMOT).

Ang hakbang na ito ay alinsunod sa pagsusulong ng Universal Health Care (UHC) Act upang matiyak na ang bawat Pilipino ay protektado laban sa mataas na gastusing medikal nang hindi na kinakailangan pang ma-ospital.

Sa ilalim ng PhilHealth YAKAP, ang mga miyembro at kanilang mga dependents ay makakatanggap ng mga sumusunod na benepisyo sa kanilang napiling YAKAP clinic:

- Primary Care Check-up at assessment mula sa isang Primary Care Doctor ng napiling YAKAP Clinic.
- 13 Basic Outpatient Laboratory Tests:
 1. Complete Blood Count (CBC) with Platelet Count
 2. Lipid Profile
 3. Fasting Blood Sugar (FBS)
 4. Oral Glucose Tolerance Test (OGTT)

 8. Sputum Microscopy
 9. Electrocardiogram (ECG)
 10. Urinalysis
 11. Pap Smear
 12. Fecalysis
 13. Fecal Occult Blood Test (FOBT)
- 6 na Uri ng Anti-Cancer Screening Tests (para sa maagang pagtuklas ng sakit):
 1. Breast Ultrasound
 2. Mammography
 3. Alpha Fetoprotein
 4. Liver Ultrasound
 5. Colonoscopy
 6. Low-dose Chest CT Scan

Sa ilalim naman ng programang GAMOT, may hanggang ₱20,000.00 halaga ng pangunahing gamot kada taon ang bawat miyembro. Sakop nito ang 54 na klase ng mahalalagang gamot kabilang ang:

1. Anti-Infectious
2. Anti-Hypertensive & Cardiology
3. Nervous System
4. Anti-Thrombotics
5. Anti-Asthma & COPD
6. Anti-Diabetics
7. Anti-Dyslipidemia

Samantalang ang 21 essential medicines ay makukuha sa napiling YAKAP clinic.

Upang masiguro na mararamdaman ng mga mamamayan sa Cavite, Laguna, at Quezon ang alaga ng PhilHealth, patuloy ang proseso ng akreditasyon ng mga pasilidad sa buong rehiyon.

Sa kasalukuyan, mayroong 296 YAKAP providers sa Region 4A, kung saan 265 dito ay YAKAP-ready facilities na nakapag-comply na sa mga strict readiness requirements ng PhilHealth. Samantala, pinalawak na rin ang network ng mga partner pharmacies kung saan mayroon nang 223 PhilHealth GAMOT Providers sa buong rehiyon na rehistrado at handang mag-dispense ng mga libreng gamot sa mga miyembro.

Para sa mapakinabangan ang programa, narito ang apat na Simpleng Hakbang:

1. Assignment: MagpaPumili at magpatala sa isang YAKAP Provider gamit ang eGovPH mobile app o sa pinakamalapit na PhilHealth Local Health Insurance Office (LHIO).
2. First Patient Encounter (FPE): Bumisita sa napiling YAKAP clinic para sa pagsusuri at pagtukoy ng tamang pangangalaga ng kalusugan.
3. Empanelment: Pagpirma ng YAKAP Empanelment Slip (YES) para sa pagtataguyod ng pormal na ugnayan o relasyon sa pagitan ng miyembro at ng napiling Primary Care Clinic (PCC).
4. Konsultasyon: Magpatingin sa YAKAP doctor ng clinic para mabigyan ng e-prescription kung kinakailangan gamot at laboratoryo/ tests.
5. Dispensing sa GAMOT Provider: Dalhin ang reseta sa alinmang accredited GAMOT pharmacy

Ang patuloy na pagdami ng mga PhilHealth YAKAP at GAMOT facilities sa Region IV-A ay patunay ng dedikasyon ng ahensya na ilapit ang serbisyong medikal sa mga komunidad upang ang bawat pamilyang Pilipino ay manatiling "malayo sa sakit."

TOP PERFORMING MUNICIPAL MAYORS IN THE PROVINCE OF CAVITE (MONTH OF MAY, 2026)

The Social Pulse Philippines - Pulso ng Bayan Survey for the month of May 2026 highlights the Top Performing Municipal Mayors in the Province of Cavite, based on the feedback of 1,000 respondents. The survey was conducted from June 1-3, 2026, with a margin of error of ±3%. Leading the rankings is Mayor SM Matro of Tanza, who emerged as the highest-performing municipal mayor in Cavite with an impressive 96.7% satisfaction rating, reflecting strong public confidence and approval of his administration.

Following closely is Mayor Randy Salamat of Alfonso with 96.1%, while Mayor Umbe Arca of Maragondon secured the third spot with 95.3%.

Completing the top five are Mayor Davey Chua of Noveleta with 94.2% and Mayor Virgilio Fidel of Indang with 93.5%, showcasing continued public satisfaction with their leadership and governance.

DTI Cavite Conducts 2026 OTOP Next Gen Assessment, Consultation, and Triage Session



Trece Martires City, Cavite — The Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) Cavite, in partnership with the Office of the Provincial Cooperatives Development Officer, successfully conducted the first session of

the 2026 OTOP Next Gen: Assessment, Consultation, and Triage (ACT) on May 13, 2026, at the Session Hall of the New Provincial Capitol, Trece Martires City.

The activity aimed to assess the current needs and business conditions of the 2026

OTOP beneficiaries and to provide them with appropriate technical assistance, mentoring, and government support services to further enhance their products and market readiness.

To address the concerns and development needs of par-

ticipating MSMEs, representatives and consultants from the Food and Drug Administration (FDA), Intellectual Property Office of the Philippines (IPOPHL), Office of the Provincial Agriculturist, and Department of Science and Technology (DOST), along with

the program's hired designer, were invited to provide consultations and recommendations. These focused on key areas such as product development, packaging and labeling, food safety compliance, intellectual property protection, and innovation.

MPTC Promotes Responsible Driving Through Mission Road Safety BiyaHero Caravan

Metro Pacific Tollways Corporation (MPTC), together with its subsidiaries NLEX Corporation and MPT South, reinforced its commitment to safer roads by bringing together national government agencies, local government units, transport groups, and private sector partners for the "Mission Road Safety BiyaHero Caravan." The program aims to enhance the practical skills, safety alertness, and responsible driving culture of drivers and operators.

Held at One Ayala in Makati City and Victory Plaza in Caloocan City, the caravan brought together 284 jeepney, UV express, and bus drivers from 42 transport organizations and companies for learning sessions and interactive activities focused on road safety.

"At MPTC, safety remains at the core of everything we do. Through programs like the BiyaHero Road Safety Caravan, we aim to further equip drivers with the knowledge they need to make safer decisions on the road. While protocols and systems are in

place to enhance road safety, achieving safer journeys requires the shared responsibility and cooperation of all road users," said MPTC Chief Operations and Maintenance Officer West Dionisio.

Participants also benefited from free eye screenings and prescription eyeglasses, while Easytrip representatives provided on-site assistance for RFID installation and transaction concerns.

The road safety caravan was conducted in partnership with the Toll Regulatory Board (TRB), the Department of Health (DOH), the Road Safety Division of the Provincial Government of Cavite, the Public Safety and Traffic Management Department of the City Government of Caloocan, One Ayala, and Victory Plaza.

A key session facilitated by TRB Regulation Division Chief Joz Carlos Ordillano tackled common traffic violations among buses, trucks, public utility vehicles (PUVs), and motorcycles — these include speeding, improper lane use, unsafe overtaking, tailgating, distracted driving, and overloading. He also highlighted how some driving habits, while often considered routine, can create safety risks for motorists and commuters alike.

To make learning more engaging, participants took part in a driving simulator experience, drunk goggles challenge, and an interactive road safety quiz.

MPTC also continues to amplify road safety messages through the digital platforms of NLEX Corp., MPT South, and CCLEC, reaching motorists with information on proper expressway driving, traffic regulations, vehicle roadworthiness, and travel preparedness.

Through the years, MPTC has institutionalized its multi-stakeholder road safety initiatives across its expressways network in Luzon and Visayas— NLEX, SCTEX, NLEX Connector, CALAX, CAVITEX, CAVITEX C5 Link, and CCLEC — earning rec-
