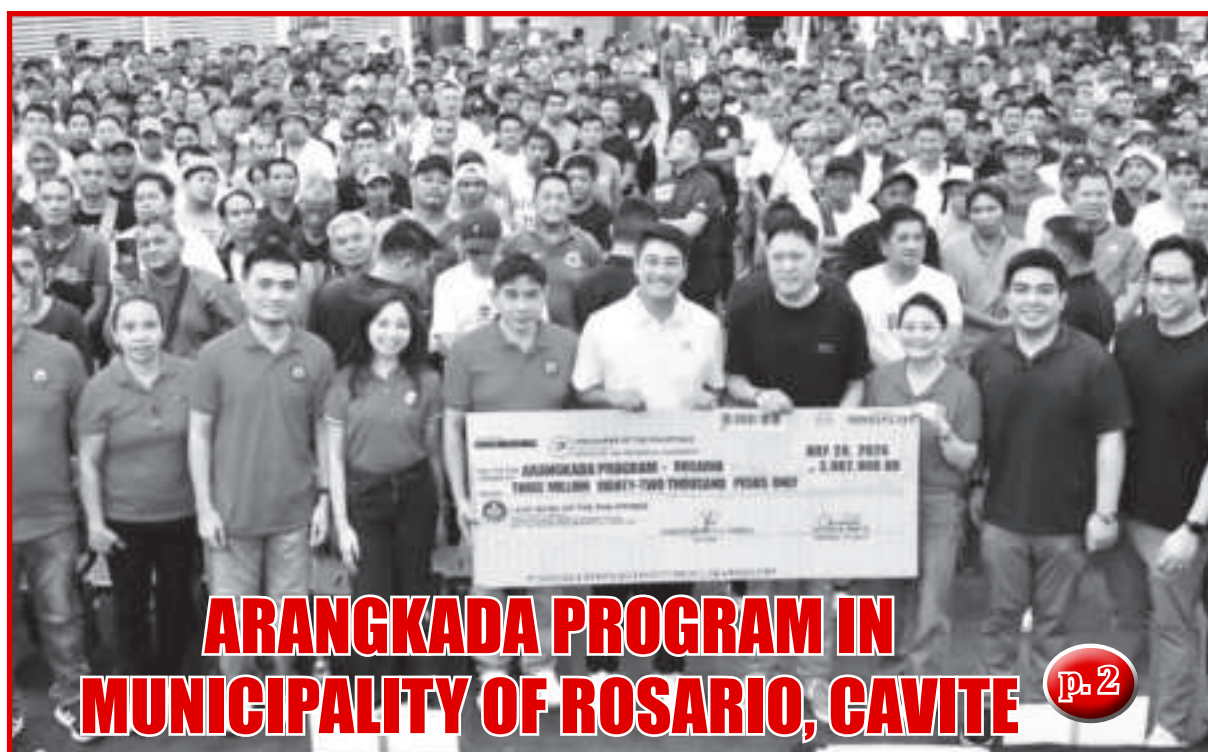

SSS members now a step closer to accessing microloans as SSS, RCBC formalize partnership to roll out SSS LoanLite through the DiskarTech app

MANILA, Philippines - The Social

Security System (SSS) and Rizal Commercial Banking Corporation (RCBC) formalized their partnership through a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) for the rollout of SSS LoanLite powered by RCBC DiskarTech on 11 August 2026 at the Yuchengco Museum in RCBC Plaza, Makati City.

SSS LoanLite is a fully digital lending service that allows qualified SSS members to apply



for microloans ranging from P1,000 to P20,000

through the DiskarTech app, providing conve-

nient and secure access to financial assistance.

The MOA was signed by SSS President

and CEO Robert Joseph M. de Claro, Senior Vice President Joy A. Villacorta, and Senior Vice President Pedro T. Baoy, and RCBC President and CEO Reggie B. Cariaso, Executive Vice President and Chief Innovation and Inclusion Officer Lito Villanueva, and First Vice President and Head of Digital Loans and Business Development Jose Carlo Eufemio, in the presence of RCBC Chairperson Helen Y. SSS continues support to the local market as part of nation building while exploring international investments to balance portfolio

QUEZON CITY, 12 August 2026 - The Social Security System (SSS) an-

nounced today its plan to expand its investment portfolio in foreign markets while continuing to actively participate in the domestic capital

markets, as part of its strategy to diversify assets, enhance returns, and strengthen the long-term sustainability of the pension fund.

SSS President and Chief Executive Officer Robert Joseph M. de Claro said the SSS' improved financial position provides greater capacity to pursue investment opportunities while continuing to contribute to nation-building through investments in the domestic market.

"We are very conservative, but at the same time, we are also in a very good position now because of our surplus, that for the first time, we have an opportunity to help in nation-building," de Claro said.

As of 30 June 2026, SSS had P1.27 trillion in consolidated investments, distributed across various asset classes in the domestic market. These include

P629.05 billion in government securities, P179.44 billion in equities, P154.56 billion in property, P151.90 billion in member loans, and P96.34 billion in corporate notes and bonds, among others.

The diversified portfolio generated P27.16 billion in actual investment income as of 30 June 2026, equivalent to an annualized return on investment of 4.53 percent. The figures exclude realized gains from the sale of equity securities classified as fair value through other comprehensive income (FVTOCI).

SSS remains an active institutional investor in the Philippine capital market through investments in equities,

government securities, and other financial instruments allowed under its investment policies. Its exploration of international investments is intended to complement, not replace, its existing domestic investments, providing greater diversification across markets and asset classes.

The planned overseas expansion will allow SSS to explore additional investment opportunities while maintaining its role in supporting the local capital market.

He emphasized that exploring overseas investments does not mean reducing SSS' participation in the Philippine market. Rather, the initiative is intended to

SSS offers existing Emergency Loan Program to members affected by Tropical Storm Maymay, Habagat

Q U E Z O N CITY, 17 August 2026 – The Social Security System (SSS) announced that members affected by Tropical Storm Maymay and the enhanced Southwest Monsoon (Habagat) may avail themselves of the existing Emergency Loan Program (ELP) to help address their financial needs arising from the calamity.

SSS President and Chief Executive Officer Robert Joseph M. de Claro said the ELP remains available to qualified members nationwide and serves as a readily accessible source of financial assistance for those experiencing financial hardship due to calamities and other emergency situations.

"The ELP is part of SSS' continuing commitment to provide immediate financial relief to members affected by unforeseen events. Through the ELP, qualified members affected by Tropical Storm Maymay and the enhanced Southwest Monsoon may access much-needed financial assistance under more flexible eligibility requirements," de Claro said.

"Under the ELP, which has been in effect since 01 May 2026, the required number of monthly contributions has been reduced from 36 to 18, provided that the member has at least six posted contributions in the last 12 months," de Claro said.

He added that self-employed, voluntary, non-working spouse, and land-based Overseas Filipino Worker (OFW) members must have at least six-monthly contributions under their current membership type before the month of loan application.

Other eligibility requirements are as follows:

- *Under 65 years old at the time of loan application;

- *Have a valid Philippine home address on SSS records;

- *Have an updated contact information in the SSS database;

- *Have no past-due emergency, calamity, salary, Educational Assistance Loan, or other short-term or long-term member loans;

- *Have no outstanding restructured loan;

- *Have not been disqualified due to fraud committed against the

SSS;

- *Have not been granted any final benefit like retirement or permanent total disability benefits; and

- *Have an active disbursement account enrolled through the Disbursement Account Enrollment Module (DAEM) in the My.SSS Portal.

Qualified members may borrow up to ₱20,000 at an interest rate as low as 7% per annum. The loan is payable over 30 months, inclusive of a six-month moratorium period.

"Members are not required to make monthly amortization payments during the first six months from the date of loan approval. No penalties will be imposed during this period. Regular monthly amortization payments will begin in the seventh month," de Claro explained.

De Claro added that members affected by the tropical cyclone may also apply for an SSS salary loan at the same time, subject to the eligibility requirements.

Members may apply online for both the ELP and the salary loan through the My.SSS Portal at www.sss.gov.ph. #

Home of frozen favorites

People value convenience. As daily life becomes busier, the demand for easy, practical meal options continues to rise. Not only do these products save time and money, but their longer shelf life also helps reduce food waste by allowing consumers to store and enjoy them over time.

In 2020, Sahlee Quizon from Sta. Cruz, Laguna, started her frozen food business with her first product: boneless milkfish

(bangus). Known for its countless tiny bones, the fish had once been the cause of a choking incident that nearly cost Sahlee her life.

After that incident, she promised herself that one day she would enjoy bangus without fearing its bones. That promise led her to create her version of boneless bangus. Sahlee started her business while still working as a company employee. As demand grew, she left her job to focus on her venture. What started as a personal solution to a struggle eventually became her bread and butter.

After a decade of working for different companies, Sahlee discovered that nothing compares to the freedom of running her own business and the flexible schedule that comes with it.

"Pagdating kasi sa negosyo, umaga pa lang mayroon ka ng pera; kumbaga hindi mo na kailangan hintayin ang kinsenas at katapusan, basta masipag ka, araw-araw ka kikita." (Unlike in a regular job where you wait for payday, your earnings in business depend on your effort. Being hardworking and consistent can make more profit every day).

To reach more customers, she also posts her products online. With today's growing shift toward digitalization, her online presence has helped her connect with a wider market, including resellers.

Currently, she has four resellers that help distribute her products. Over time, she expanded beyond boneless bangus and began offering other homemade products, including tocino, longganisa, shanghai, embutido, chicken inasal, barbecue, and siomai. Exploring other products became easier for her since her mother's business was also in the frozen food industry.

As her business grew, competition became inevitable. However, she remains unfazed, believing that success comes down to those who produce better quality products.

Every day, she mostly uses up to 60 kilos of meat and 20 kilos of bangus. Although the work is physically demanding, she chooses to handle it by herself to ensure that the quality and taste remain consistent.

For Sahlee, the recipe for a good business is a combination of hard work and perseverance.

"Sa simula, may mga pagkakataon na hindi lahat ng produkto ay maibebenta sa isang araw, pero darating yung panahon na babalik-balikan ito ng customers mo." (There will be slow days, but there will come a time when people will keep coming back for more; until that happens, keep grinding)," she stated.

Financial support from the bank

In 2013, she became a client of CARD MRI Rizal Bank Inc. (CARD RBI), a microfinance-oriented rural bank under CARD Mutually Reinforcing Institutions (CARD MRI). For nearly 13 years, she has relied on CARD RBI for both her family and business needs. She took an educational loan for her children, a housing loan, and additional capital to support the start of her business in 2020.

Currently, she has an active loan of PHP 95,000.00, which she uses as additional capital for her venture.

Through her business, she has sent all five of her children to school, with three now professionals and the two youngest still in college, pursuing their respective dreams.

To this day, she continues to post her products online as part of her marketing strategy. Looking ahead, she remains hopeful and determined to grow her business further, aiming to reach more customers and create more opportunities for expansion.

Pres. Marcos Jr. creates TWG to fast-track Sangley airport project in Cavite

MANILA – President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. has created a joint technical working group (JTWG) to fast-track the development and completion of the Sangley Point International Airport (SPIA) Project in Cavite.

In a statement, the Presidential Communications Office said Thursday that under Administrative Order (AO) 44, the JTWG will be co-chaired by the Department of Transportation (DOTr) and the Philippine Reclamation Authority (PRA). Its members include the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR), Department of National

Defense, Department of the Interior and Local Government, Department of Justice, Civil Aviation Authority of the Philippines (CAAP), and the provincial government of Cavite.

Signed on June 3, AO 44 directs the JTWG to address issues that could delay the SPIA Project and ensure that reclamation activities comply with environmental and technical requirements under existing laws, rules, and regulations.

The group will submit quarterly progress reports to the Office of the Executive Secretary, covering project milestones, compliance measures, issues encountered, and recommendations for presi-

dential action.

It may also recommend policy directives to the President to keep the project on schedule and aligned with national development priorities.

"There is a need to enhance coordination of various government agencies, local government units (LGUs) in the province of Cavite, and private sector partners, and streamline regulatory and administrative processes, in order to ensure the timely completion of the SPIA," AO 44 stated.

"The JTWG, in coordination with other concerned government agencies, is hereby directed to take all necessary actions to ensure that the Sangley Point

land is available for the development and implementation of the SPIA," it added.

The DOTr will provide overall policy direction on air transport and civil aviation and coordinate government actions for the airport's development to support safe, reliable, efficient, and convenient air travel.

It will also oversee the integration of the SPIA into the Greater Capital Region Airport System and the country's air transport network.

CAAP will provide technical and regulatory oversight of the airport's planning, design, development, and operational readiness, including the issuance of

required certifications and authorizations.

The PRA, meanwhile, will oversee the project's reclamation component, including the review and approval of reclamation plans and enforcement of technical standards and compliance requirements.

It will also review applicable fees and charges for the project's non-saleable reclamation component.

AO 44 requires strict compliance with the Environmental Impact Statement System, Environmental Compliance Certificate, conditions under Letters of No Objection and Area Clearance, and other applicable laws and regulations.

"Environmental

monitoring mechanisms shall be established by the DENR and PRA to safeguard marine and coastal ecosystems affected by reclamation and construction activities," the order read.

The AO takes effect immediately upon publication in the Official Gazette or a newspaper of general circulation.

The SPIA is a flagship local public-private partnership project envisioned as an international logistics hub with a container port and airport complex.

In 2023, the Cavite government entered into a Joint Venture and Development Agreement with the SPIA Development Consortium to implement the project. (PNA)

The program also featured a tribute honoring the coordinated

success of PhilHealth and its partners over the past 18 months, recognizing the collective effort behind the gains made in advancing UHC reforms. Primary Care Champion and Department of Finance Secretary, Frederick D. Go, expressed his support for, and confidence in the agencies' shared agenda. ADB Director of the Human and Social Development Sector Office, and former PhilHealth President and CEO, Dr. Eduardo Banzon, commended the progress PhilHealth has made over the past

year. PhilHealth recognizes both leaders as pillars of support of the Build UHC Program, whose continued partnership has been instrumental in driving the impact and reach of PhilHealth's programs nationwide.

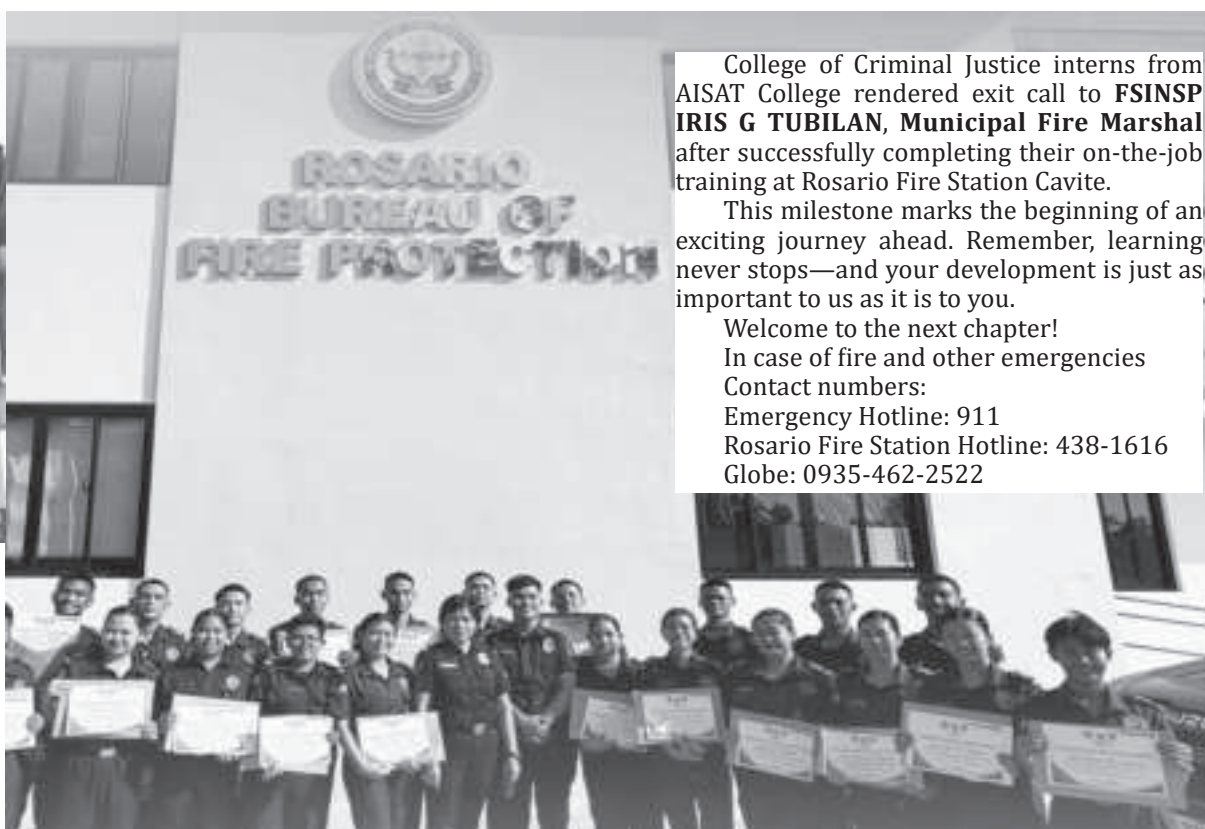

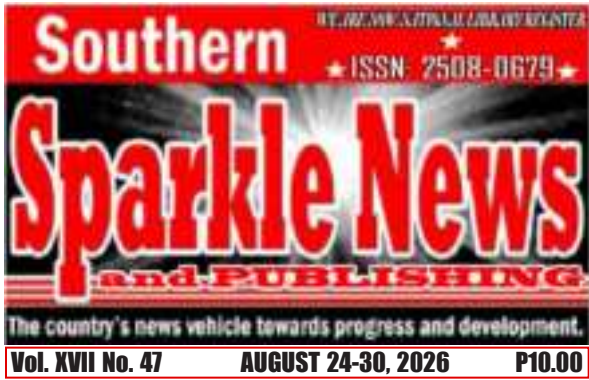
PGC Brings Healthcare Closer to Dasmariñas Community
