(PRC) chairperson Richard Gordon emphasized that today's generation should learn more about the battle's history, which was a decisive victory against the Spanish forces.

"Hindi lang ito isang labanan na natutuwa tayo. Dapat malaman at maituro sa eskwela ito sapagkat itong labanang ito ang nagbigay-daan para sa ating kalayaan. It is important for us to remember na ang labanan na ito ay laban ng mga Pilipino sa ating bansa, labanan na kahit salat sa gamit at sa armas ay nabuo at lumago."

Gordon emphasized that the revolutionaries did not have the weaponry that matched that of their enemies, the Battle of Imus teaches a valuable lesson on perseverance and courage—values that remain relevant amid the issues the country faces today.

"If we forget the sacrifices of our leaders ay walang mangyayari sa Pilipinas. That is why dapat maituro ito because this is the very first victory of our very poor Filipinos as they fought for a country that did not exist at that time."

For Mayor Alex Advincula, the Battle of Imus remains deeply relevant today, serving as a reminder of the unity and patriotism needed to face the country's current challenges.

"Ipagpatuloy natin ang malasakit at pagkakaisa. Ito po 'yung nawawala ngayon, nawawala na po ang malasakit sa ating bayan. Alam naman po nating dugo at pawis ang puhunan ng ating mga ninuno kaya natin nakamtam ang gantong kalayaan."

Advincula added, "Mayroon pong mga problema ang ating lungsod, pero hindi kaya nang nag-iisa ito, kailangan po nito ng tugong-tulong muli natin."

The mayor also noted that while the city faces its own challenges—such as flooding—it remains committed to transparency and accountability to help

resolve broader issues affecting Philippine governance.

"Ipinapakita natin dito sa Imus 'yung transparency, [nilalabanan natin] 'yung kurapsyon na inalis natin. Pero hindi natin kayang biglain at inuunti-unti natin, lahat naman ng mga kababayan natin ay sumuporta. Nakikita natin na ang may pagkakaisa."

Led by General

Emilio Aguinaldo and Jose Tagle, the Battle of Imus was a three-day engagement between Spanish forces and Filipino revolutionaries that marked the first major victory of the Philippine Revolution. It is considered the most decisive early battle of the uprising and a key turning point in Philippine history.

Realizing dreams in Tinapa's smoke

In Nangu-
ma, Mabitac, Laguna, one woman is busy preserving fish with flavors to produce products she will later sell in her town.

Sheryl Jamillo, now 46, is a mother of nine children and was a full-time housewife. For her, managing a household is not easy. But relying solely on her husband's income made it even more challenging.

Faced with limited options, Sheryl took the courage to go beyond balancing the demands of family life to find a source of income. But having only reached her first year of high school, she found it hard to find a job that would also allow her to juggle her responsibilities as a mother. So, from everything she could offer, she tried starting a business. She started buying smoked fish (tinapa) and reselling it in their town.

In 2016, after being invited by her friend, Sheryl became a client of CARD, Inc. (A Microfinance NGO). Through the financial services she can avail herself of as a client, her business mindset also transforms.

Instead of just reselling smoked fish, Sheryl decided to learn how to process it herself. Using her first loan from CARD, Inc., she began setting up her own tinapa processing business. She embraced the hard work of sourcing good-quality raw fish, cleaning it, and mastering the art of flavoring and smoking. Over time, she was able to produce tinapa on her own.

Because Sheryl now processes her own tinapa, she was also able to elevate its taste, ensuring it's all perfectly golden and flavorful. Customers have started recognizing her product and coming back for more. Aside from enhancing the flavor, Sheryl also puts effort into improving her tinapa's appearance so it appeals to the appetite and attracts customers. "Kasi kung masarap nga siya, eh kung mukha namang madungis, hindi rin siya kaagad bibilhin (Because even if it tastes good, customers still won't buy it if it doesn't look presentable)," she said. For her, a good product needs to look just as good as it tastes.

For almost ten years, Sheryl has utilized CARD, Inc.'s loan services, including educational loans for her children's enrollment and studies, especially her fourth child, who is now entering college. She also availed of a housing loan to build their house in Brgy. Nanguma.

Challenges also came to her business, especially when sales were slow and when fish were expensive. In times like these, Sheryl can sustain it by taking additional loans to help her smoked fish business recover. Saving with the microfinance institution also helps her ensure she has something to withdraw in times of scarcity.

Today, loyal customers continue to buy her smoked fish. Some store owners in the market also order wholesale from her. One loyal customer buys from her to resell the product abroad.

For all of this, Sheryl's advice is simply patience and discipline. "Tiyaga lang (Just stay patient)," she said. "Tapos kapag mahirap ang panahon ng negosyo, e di konting tipid (And when business isn't doing well, it's best to cut back some expenses)."

Just like the smoke curling upward from her tinapa, Sheryl started with a simple goal: to earn a living for her family. But more than surviving, she stepped up, thrived despite the market challenges, and learned to dream.

Sheryl plans to keep growing the business she built so one day, she can pass it down to her children.

ARANGKADA PROGRAM IN BACCOOR CITY, CAVITE

Mayor Strike Revilla, Vice Mayor Rowena Bautista-Mendiola, and members of the Sangguniang Panlungsod.

The Arangkada Program continues its province-wide rollout, bringing assistance closer to Caviteños transportation sector.

Handog ng Pangulo brings government services closer to Caviteños



More than 5,000 Caviteños benefited from various government services and assistance during Handog ng Pangulo, Serbisyong Sapat para sa Lahat, a government service convergence initiative held on September 14 at the New Provincial Government Center in Trece Martires City, simultaneously with activities in various cities and provinces nationwide.

Leading the Cavite activity was DILG Secretary Juanito Victor Remulla, together with Governor Abeng Remulla, Vice Governor Ram Revilla Bautista, 7th District Representative Ping Remulla, provincial board members, and mayors from Cavite's cities and municipalities.

The activity brought together the Provincial Government of Cavite (PGC) and participating national government agencies (NGAs), providing one-stop access to essential services, livelihood and agricul-

tural assistance, educational support, legal services, health care, employment opportunities, and other government programs.

Among the major assistance provided was the Rice Distribution Program, which served 5,000 beneficiaries from Barangay Cabuco, Trece Martires City.

Participating agencies also delivered substantial sector-specific assistance. TESDA distributed allowances, training support funds, starter toolkits, and scholarship vouchers, while NIA Cavite-Batangas awarded livelihood projects, including a ₱300,000 Rice-Duck Farming Livelihood Project, ₱210,000 High-Value Crop Production with Drip Irrigation System Project, and ₱500,000 RTL Chicken Project for the CY 2026 Most Outstanding Irrigators Association at the regional level.

The Department of Agriculture provided ₱4,034,902 worth of



agricultural programs and services, while DTI-Cavite awarded ₱673,000 for an Ideation, Design, and Development Laboratory and ₱580,000 for a Coffee Roasting Facility.

For education and migrant assistance, CHED RO IV-A granted ₱1.86 million in UniFAST assistance to qualified Cavite State University grantees, while DMW RO IV-A extended ₱8.1 million through the AKSYON Fund for overseas Filipino workers in need.

Meanwhile, BFAR

IV-A provided three FRP boats worth ₱210,000, ₱1.8 million worth of inputs for three HDPE fish cages, and ₱15 million for the establishment of a Common Post-Harvest Facility under the Fish-CoRe Project.

Legal and public assistance were also made available through the Department of Justice-Office of the Provincial Prosecutor-Cavite, Public Attorney's Office, Department of Agrarian Reform-Cavite, Bureau of Immigration, OWWA RWO IV-A, Land Registration Authority-Reg-

istry of Deeds, and Philippine Crop Insurance Corporation. The DOH Center for Health Development-CALABARZON likewise turned over assistive devices, including wheelchairs, canes, and crutches, to identified beneficiaries.

The PGC, through the Office of the Governor Medical Mission Team, provided medical and dental consultations, while the Office of the Provincial Public Employment Service Manager (OPPEM) facilitated a job fair for Caviteños seeking local

and overseas employment.

The Handog ng Pangulo highlighted the government's commitment to bringing services closer to the people through a coordinated, one-stop delivery of programs and assistance. Through the convergence of the PGC and participating NGAs, Caviteños gained easier access to services supporting their health, livelihood, education, agriculture, employment, legal concerns, and overall welfare.--- OPIO

Ayon sa PhilHealth, mahalagang bahagi ng programa ang paglapit mismo sa mga komunidad ng serbisyo sa ilalim ng YAKAP upang matiyak na ang mga miyembro ay may access sa mga serbisyo ng pamahalaan nang hindi na kinakailangang bumiyahang malalayo. Lalo itong mahalaga para sa mga residente ng mga geographically isolated and disadvantaged areas (GIDA), kung saan madalas na limitado ang access sa impormasyon at serbisyon pangkalusugan.

Bukod sa pagbibigay ng impormasyon at serbisyo, binibigyang-diin din ng PhilHealth ang kahalagahan ng opinyon at karanasan ng mga miyembro. Ayon sa PhilHealth, ang feedback mula sa mga miyembro ay mahalagang kasangkapan sa pagtukoy ng mga puwang o kakulangan sa paghahatid ng serbisyo at sa pagtiyak na ang mga programa at benepisyon ipinatutupad ay tunay na tumutugon sa aktuwal na pangangailangan at karanasan ng mga Pilipino. Sa pamamagitan ng aktibong pakikinig sa mga miyembro, mas napabubuti at napapalakas ang mga serbisyo upang maging mas abot-kaya, at kapaki-pakinabang para sa lahat.

Free Medical and Dental Services at Montano Hall, Cavite City

MEDICAL & DENTAL MISSION HELD IN BARANGAY BACAO, GENERAL TRIAS CITY

On September 9, 2026, a Medical and Dental Mission was successfully conducted in Barangay Bacao 2, General Trias City, providing essential healthcare services to residents of the community.

A total of 490 patients were served during the mission, with 412 patients receiving medical consultations and 42 patients availing of dental services. Additional diagnostic services were also provided, including 11 ECG tests and 25 FBS (Fast-ing Blood Sugar) tests.

The activity was attended by City Councilor Kyle Salazar, who



joined and supported the community health-care initiative.

The mission was made possible through the assistance of the Barangay Nutrition Scholars (BNS) and Barangay Health Workers (BHWs). Dental services were provided by the City of General Trias dental team, while medical consultations were conducted by health-care professionals from General Emilio Aguinaldo Memorial Hospital.

Medical and Dental Mission Brings Care to Imuseños

The medical and dental mission was among the frontline services offered through the Cavite Service Caravan, reflecting the Governor's commitment to making vital government assistance more accessible to communities across the province.

A total of 871 residents received medical consultations, while 53 availed of dental services. The healthcare mission also provided 14 fluoride applications, 200 fasting blood sugar (FBS) tests, and 48 electrocardiogram (ECG) procedures, giving residents access to essential healthcare and basic diagnostic services within their community.

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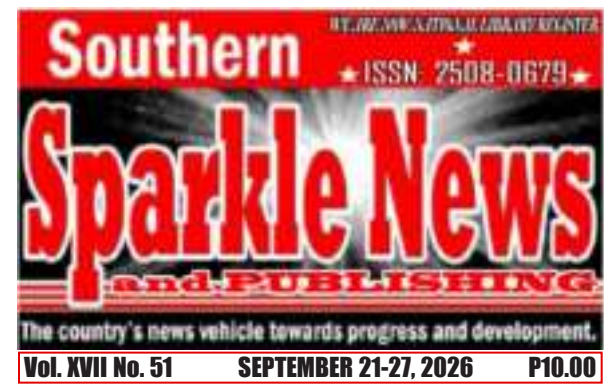
ARANGKADA PROGRAM IN IMUS CITY, CAVITE

The Provincial Government of Cavite's Arangkada Program is happening today, September 17, at the
